 Discussion regarding the by-law committee and their discussions of the district polices. Commissioner Kugler visited Jonesville Fire District for some ideas, and looking at different by-laws from different districts. Commissioner Kugler noted the by-law committee should be handling just the by-laws; the policies should be handled by the Commissioners. Will also be looking to visit Clifton Park next week, and going forward the policies will be determined by the Commissioners and the by-law committee will take care of the by-laws. Commissioner Atwell noted if someone has a problem with the polices, he has no problem with that person bringing it to a Board Member's attention to look into, as all policies have been reviewed by the attorney and are used to protect everyone. Commissioner Mann also noted that for those going to the Turning Stone Conference there is a seminar on by-laws and maybe someone can go to that and bring the information back. It was noted George Miller is the Chairman of the by-law committee and maybe he should attend.

9. <u>District Guideline Review:</u>

- Restricted Duty Policy: Joyce noted changes were made to the policy by the bylaw committee and she has some concerns about it. Brief discussion; Joyce to make necessary changes and submit to Board for review, and added to March 11th agenda for approval.

Clarification was made that firefighters are responsible for having their uniforms dry cleaned at their expense, change to badge placements and certifications bar added.

10. Special Topics of Discussion:

- Kincaid Network Services: Jill explained that under the contract, Kincaid would come in, go over the district's IT equipment, including sonic walls, firewalls, etc, and build it back up to current state of the art equipment. They will also work on the I Am Responding system issues, security on the district computers and provide any necessary support throughout the year. She will be calling them to set up a meeting for further explanation/discussion. Tentatively added to March 11th agenda for Board decision.
- The Board had asked Dave and Marcus for quotes based on the insurance review meeting, and some decisions need to be made. Brief discussion continued. Joyce noted she is still waiting for quotes on the Cyber insurance and Excess Indemnification coverage, board agreed to raise building deductible to \$1000 and noted there is no need to look into quotes for fiduciary liability.

- D/C Ellsworth noted he has been having problems with the neighbor across from
 the street from the firehouse regarding the kids riding their snowmobiles and 4wheelers all across the property and doing donuts in the parking lot, even though
 they were given permission to only ride on the north side of the property to the
 trails. Spoke to the father a couple of times already and told him that next time he
 would be sending the Sheriff instead.
- D/C King noted that over the past 2 weeks there have been a few fires and guys have done an awesome job stopping them, they should be real proud.
- D/C Ellsworth noted the snow has gotten so high against the firehouse and windows, he asked Derrick to come and push the snow banks back and pull some of the snow away from the building, but he may have to come and bring his own machine as well.
- Commissioner Chandler opened up discussion regarding New Member
 Orientation and the new firefighter 1 curriculum. Captain Barss gave a brief
 explanation of what has been done so far at Co #2, the new requirements for
 FF1 and that firefighters will not be receiving any instruction on it except at the
 department level, but will be tested on it at FF1. Discussion also regarding
 mentor involvement and how to incorporate the new firefighter 1 curriculum into
 New Member Orientation. Joyce and Captain Barss to meet to work on updating
 New Member Orientation curriculum.
