- Ellsworth
 - Spoke to Christian about the EMS budget. Brief discussion.
 - Confirmed that everyone was up to speed on the dent in the trailer that was not a dent.
 - Questioned the cable bills; it was noted the \$144 is for internet only at each of the stations & Co #2 cable bill is \$11 per month, paid by the district. Discussion continued.
 - Brief discussion regarding Co #3 radio programming; identifiers need to be corrected.
 - The training building looks like it has a demolished window that needs to be replaced.
 Brief discussion continued.
 - $\circ~$ Erik is willing to take BOCES classes at night, at district expense. He will coordinate with Erik.
 - Attended the County meeting where there was discussion about ER/ESO. There are many other options out there rather than spending \$20,000. Lengthy discussion continued, including information received on Emergency Networking, as well as that it was mentioned that Vector Solutions may be dropping Halligan.

- Moving of National Grid pole: Chief Davis noted he spoke to Walt Schleezer in reference to moving the pole, he said it is not an issue and they can move the pole. Waiting to hear back from him. Brief discussion.
- Commissioner Ellsworth noted that he met with Justin and the cost to pave the road behind the pavilion at Co #4 is about \$10,500.00.
- Lengthy discussion regarding F/Y 2024 budget. The Treasurer explained all the changes that have been made to date by her, Doug and Commissioner Ellsworth. It was noted there are a lot of grants out there, and suggestion made to hire a grant writer. Several changes made; draft budget is currently under the tax cap by \$500.00. - Commissioner Ramsey noted he is concerned, but not necessarily opposed to, sending Erik to BOCES, but he would like to talk about it with board. Commissioner Ellsworth will look into the cost of BOCES. Brief discussion.
